Associated Care Centres (“we” or “us”) is committed to ensuring that your privacy is protected. We will continue to comply with the provisions of the Data Protection Act (“DPA”) until 25 May 2018, after which we will comply with the General Data Protection Regulation ((EU) 2016/679) (“GDPR”) unless and until the GDPR is no longer directly applicable in the UK, together with any national implementing laws, regulations and secondary legislation as amended or updated from time to time in the UK, and any successor legislation to the GDPR and the DPA (together “Data Protection Legislation”). This Privacy Policy together with our cookie policy sets out how we collect personal information from you and how the personal information you provide will be processed by us. If you do not consent, please do not submit any personal data to us.

Our Principles

- We'll only collect and use your information where we have lawful grounds and legitimate service-related reasons to do so.
- We'll be transparent in our dealings with you and tell you how we'll collect and use your information.
- If we collect your information for a particular purpose we'll only use it for that purpose, unless you've been otherwise informed and given your permission where relevant.
- We won't ask for more information than we need for the purposes for which we're collecting it.
- We'll update our records when you tell us that your details have been changed.

What information does Grenham Bay Court hold and how will we use it?

Information you give us: You may give us information about you by completing enquiry forms on the website, by requesting via the website that we send you marketing information, by linking to social media accounts, or by leaving comments and reviews. The information you give us may include your name, email address, address/location and phone number.

We will retain this information while we are corresponding with you or providing services to you or to a Service User you represent. If you are a contracted member of staff or Service User we may retain this information for a minimum of 6 or 12 years, and up to 20 or 30 years should a future claim be considered likely, in accordance with the NHS Records Management Code of Practice for Health and Social Care 2016. Unless you have elected to permanently share your personal information via comments, reviews and/or social media links, we will not retain any such information if you are not an employee or Service User.

Information Grenham Bay Court collects about you: We may collect anonymised copies of the following information from you when you visit the website:

- Technical information, including the Internet Protocol (IP) address used to connect your computer to the Internet, your login information, browser type and version, time zone setting, browser plug-in types and versions, operating system and platform; and
